

God's Whisper

As we come to the end of another calendar year, we reflect on the many people that have come to Life Counseling Ministries. We have been granted the privilege to walk alongside individuals as they look at their story and process events in their lives. People need care, support, and counsel. But our greatest call is helping

people move into spaces in their heart where they can hear from the Lord. Weary and exhausted, what they deeply long for is beyond what man has to offer.

We get glimpses of this in Scripture—men like David pleading to hear from the Lord and then proclaiming, "The heavens declare the glory of the Lord." Moses on Mt. Sinai, completely worn out in his leadership role, telling God, "Unless I see your glory I cannot continue."

Elijah, in an epic story of great faith in action, calls for a showdown on Mt. Carmel between the false prophets and their god and Elijah and his God. All in just a few days, this scene unfolds in 1 Kings 18-19. First he proclaims to the people, "How long will you hesitate between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow him." By evening, God showed up by sending fire onto the altar and then sent rain to end the 3 ½-year drought. Because of his great faith, Elijah's role as God's voice gave him a front row seat to seeing God's power.

But the next scene to this story shows Elijah running for his life after receiving a message from Jezebel. In debilitating fear and depression he ends up on Mt. Sinai, alone and in desperate need of hearing from the Lord. While Elijah was in the cave, in need of a touch, God sent a strong wind, an earthquake, and fire; but Elijah lingered in the cave. It was a gentle breeze, a quiet whisper, that drew Elijah out of the darkness. Here Elijah had his moment with

God – the only One who could revive his faith and bring him back into the battle.

Several truths from this story frequently play out in hurting people's lives. People often feel alone and abandoned in their valley, but also tend to push away friends and loved ones who can actually help them. As caregivers, some of our best work (like the angel with Elijah) is helping clients prepare for an encounter with God. Hurting individuals need a special touch, a word from God; and too often I have thought they need to hear what I have to say.

Reflecting on my current grief journey, I see depths of pain and sorrow and anguish that no word from another individual can ever cure. It doesn't minimize the incredible gift the presence of my friends have been. It is simply the awareness that only a word from God will be sufficient to meet the searing pain and the questions that surface.

As a lad, I often heard my mother singing while in the kitchen or at the sewing machine: "I need no mansion here below..." In her teenage years, she lost her father and a sister in tragic accidents and later an older brother when she was in her early twenties. The first stanza reflects her testimony and left an indelible impact on her son.

When burdens come so hard to bear, that no earthly friend can share,

Tears drive away the smiles and leave my heart in pain. Then my Lord from heaven above, speaks to me in tones of love,

Wipes the tears away and makes me smile again.

The questions counselors must ask is this, "What is God about in this person's life? How can I participate in what God is up to in this person's story?" We do fill an important role as we sit and listen and help guide the conversation. The most important is simply to invite God into our time together and then to listen for His quiet whisper.
